

Community Centers Renovation Project

Project Summary:

On January 12, 2010 a 7.2 magnitude earthquake struck Haiti leaving the country totally devastated and most of the city of Port-au-Prince and surrounding areas were totally collapsed. This disaster left many people displaced, homeless and left many children orphaned.

Life's Emergency Response Team visited the following Mosques while distributing humanitarian assistance. All 5 Mosques listed below were in need of expansion and renovations:

- **Al-Khadri Mosque**
- **YaSin Mosque**
- **Al-Fatiha Mosque**
- **Al-Taweed Mosque**
- **Allah Akbar Mosque**

Life is presently working on renovations in these 5 Mosques in Haiti which include painting, resurfacing, carpeting, roofing etc. There is still a need for generators, battery charges for use with the generators, water pumps, ceiling fans with lights, shelving for shoes and books.

Project Objectives:

This project's aim and objective is to further enhance the renovations that are taking place in 5 Mosques in Haiti to include the following objectives:

1. To purchase and install generators that can be used to provide power to 5 Mosques
2. To purchase and install battery charges that can provide 8-9 hours of continuous power to the Mosques
3. To purchase and install water pumps to move water from storage tanks to bathroom and wudu areas for worshippers to use bathroom/wudu facilities
4. To purchase and install ceiling fans with lights to provide lighting and air cooling inside the Mosques
5. To build and install shelves in the entry way of each Mosque for shoe storage
6. To build and install shelves in the Mosque libraries to place Islamic books
7. To purchase tables and chairs for each library where people can go to study Quran and read other Islamic books
8. To purchase Qurans and Islamic books in French language that can be given to each Mosque library

Timeline:

This project will take 2 months to complete in all 5 Mosques from the time the agreement is signed until the final reports are submitted to the donor

Budget:

The cost of this project is \$10,000 - \$15,000 per Mosque

Water Project

Project Summary:

On January 12, 2010 a 7.2 magnitude earthquake struck Haiti leaving the country totally devastated and most of the city of Port-au-Prince and surrounding areas were totally collapsed. This disaster left many people displaced, homeless and left many children orphaned.

Since the earthquake struck there is limited access to clean water for the general population. Life Haiti is working to provide water filtration units that can be installed in public buildings, such as schools, orphanages, Mosques, churches and camps so people can have access to clean water.

Project Objectives:

This project's aims and objectives are to:

1. To purchase and install water filtration systems in public building and camps
2. To improve access to clean water for general public
3. To improve health of children under the age of 5

Timeline:

This project will take 1 month to complete

Budget:

\$2,000 - \$5,000 per filtration unit
