Letter from the CEO

Dear respected LIFE supporter:

As we wrap up 2016, I am happy to report that thanks to the generous support of our donors and partners, many projects were successfully implemented in 23 countries across Asia, Africa, the Middle East, the Caribbean and America. Whether an area was hit by natural disasters or war and violence like in Syria, Yemen and Iraq, LIFE staff responded by bringing needed emergency relief and support to affected families. LIFE also provided medical supplies and medical equipment to hospitals and clinics in Africa and hosted two hearing aid mission trips to the Middle East.

With the belief that education is the foundation for promoting development, prosperity and peace, LIFE in collaboration with its partners, distributed books and educational materials to learning institutions ranging from grade schools to universities. We also provided school supplies and backpacks to thousands of students. In the area of community development, LIFE is in the procees of building three community centers in Mali where the people can gather for worship and social events. LIFE was also able to dig water wells that will provide a continuous supply of clean water to areas in Africa where water resources are scare.

Orphan sponsorship is one of our oldest and most precious programs. This initiative was started back in the early 1990s and continues today. As a result of natural calamities and wars, the number of orphans needing support continues to grow. This year, our traditional seasonal projects on Ramadan and Eid Al-Adha were stronger than prior years.

LIFE continues to reach more needy individuals and families throughout the world. We could not have achieved these results without the generosity and continued support of our friends, donors and partners.

I would like to take this opportunity to acknowledge the staff that was instrumental in implementing these projects, some at great risk to their lives. I also thank the LIFE Board of Directors for their contributions and stewardship.

About Life


Mission Statement

For this reason, Life is dedicated to alleviating human suffering regardless of race, color, religion, or cultural background. In response to poverty, famine, social and economic turmoil, natural disasters, war, and other catastrophes, Life works to provide assistance to people across the globe by offering humanitarian services such as food, water, and temporary shelter as well as healthcare and education.

Organizational Background

Life for Relief and Development is a non-profit humanitarian charity founded in 1992 by concerned American professionals in response to the humanitarian crises that developed in Iraq as a result of the 1991 Gulf War. Due to the great generosity of donors, Life has been able to distribute over \$464 million in humanitarian assistance items around the world, and in the process, kindly touched millions of lives.

Emergency Response

Life provided emergency food, clean water, bedding and blankets, hygiene kits, first aid kits, medicines, medical supplies & equipment for families affected by war and natural disasters.

In 2016, Life provided emergency humanitarian relief and services valued at over \$705,000 to people affected by the water crisis in Flint, Michigan, the drought in Somalia, Hurricane Matthew in Haiti, the conflict in Mosul, Iraq and to aid Syrian refugees and IDP's.

Health Programs

Life provided hearing aids to hearing impaired poor, needy and refugees and distributed donated medicines, medical supplies and medical equipment to underserved hospitals and clinics in need.

In 2016, Life provided medicines, medical aid and equipment valued at over \$1.7 million to the hearing impaired, disabled, hospitals, clinics in Iraq, Jordan, Palestine and Somalia.

Education Programs

Life promotes literacy through the distribution of books to colleges, universities, primary and secondary schools, donates classroom furniture to schools in need, gives orphans and poor school children uniforms, shoes, and school bags filled with stationary, pens, and other educational items through its back to school program.

In 2016, Life provided school bags to students, furniture and educational materials to schools, colleges and universities valued at over \$6.3 million in Ghana, Afghanistan, Somalia, Canada, Iraq, Jordan and Syria and to Native American and non-profit schools and colleges in the USA.

<u>Community/Human Development</u>

Life builds community centers where community members can gather for social events as well as funds small human development projects in Africa for poor families to enable them to start their own businesses and support their families and provides vegetable seeds to poor farmers.

In Mali, construction on three community centers has begun; Masjid Al Rahman Al Raheem in Kadiolo, Ambiya Mosque in Kemele and Mohammad Rasoolullah Sallallaho Wasalam Mosque in Fana.

Orphan Sponsorship/Social Programs

Life's orphan sponsorship program provided food, shelter, education and healthcare to over 4,550 orphans in Haiti, Jordan and Syrians.

Nearly \$875,000 in Orphan Sponsorship and Family Assistance was provided to aid orphans and to distribute assistance that was given to the poor and needy.

Water/Sanitation Programs

In 2016, Life donors provided over \$105,000 to fund the construction of 17 water wells in Ghana, Ethiopia, Mali and Somalia.

Seasonal Projects

Life spent nearly \$538,000 on its seasonal projects in 2016 which helped feed thousands of needy families in many countries throughout the world.

Ramadan

During Ramadan 2016, food baskets were distributed to poor and needy families and individuals. Each basket contained enough food items to meet the needs of a family of 5-7 for one month which eased the financial burden on the family. All items were locally procured in each country to help boost the local economy.

Life distributed food baskets to thousands of needy families and provided Iftar meals and Eid holiday gifts to poor children and orphans in Haiti, Yemen, Jordan, Lebanon, Myanmar, Palestine, Syrian and the USA.

Udhiya/Qurbani

In many countries, families wait in anticipation for Eid to arrive so they can receive fresh meat. Many families are so poor they cannot afford to buy meat at all during the entire year and Eidul-Adha is the only time that they have the opportunity to eat meat.

In 2016, Life distributed meat to over 50,000 families in 16 countries.
